CFTX Training with Future Leaders



One of the most highly anticipated events this semester is the Combined Field Training Exercise (CFTX), where our battalion will train alongside cadets from UT, UTSA, and Texas State. This joint training opportunity fosters camaraderie, knowledge-sharing, and leadership development in a collaborative environment.

During CFTX, cadets will put their tactical skills to the test through Situational Training Exercise (STX) lanes. These exercises challenge them to plan and execute squad and platoon sized missions, reinforcing their ability to lead under stressful environments. Strong communication, adaptability, and teamwork will be essential as they navigate these dynamic scenarios.

Our ROTC battalion participates in the Bataan Memorial Death March to honor the U.S. and Filipino Soldiers who endured the 65-mile forced march after surrendering to Japanese forces on April 9, 1942. Established in 1989, the event is held at White Sands Missile Range and now draws around 9,600 participants. Marchers choose between a 14.2-mile and a 26.2-mile course to remember the sacrifices of those who suffered. Our cadets proudly take part in this tradition of honor and remembrance.
